AMERICAN CHESTNUT	100'	Rapid growing hardwood, good source of nuts for wildlife.	Porous soils, sandy soils	Full sun
AMERICAN ELDERBERRY	10'	Fast growing for the berries for wine making and jellies, also for wildlife food.	Wetland tolerant or poor soils	Full sun or shade
AMERICAN HAZELNUT	10-15'	Medium growth rate, small multi-stemmed tree that produces edible nuts in September to October. Also known as American Filbert.	Adaptable to well-drained soils	Prefers full sun
AMERICAN PERSIMMON	25-40"	Sweet fragrant flowers are a favorite of honeybees, more than one is needed for pollination can sucker into groves for habitat and wildlife food.	Adaptable to well-drained soils	Full sun
AMERICAN PLUM	20'	Excellent for wildlife food and habitat provided by the small 1" size yellow to orange fruit.	Moist, moderate drained soils	Full sun
BALSAM FIR	50-70'	Statuesque form, excellent Christmas tree. Good wildlife nesting tree.	Tolerates wide range of moist soils	Partial sun Prefers north face
BAYBERRY	5-12'	Round growth habit-deep green aromatic foliage noted for its waxy gray berries in candle making; can be ornamental, two or more plants required for pollination, great for naturalizing.	Sandy, poor soils	Full sun
BLACK CHERRY	50-60'	Lustrous dark green leaves in the summer. A valuable timber tree and good food source for wildlife. Fast growing.	Tolerates wide range of soil, best in deep moist soil	Full sun
BLACK WALNUT	80'	Broad crown & compound leaves, extensive taproot, valued timber tree, nuts for wildlife.	Deep, moist	Full sun
DOUGLAS FIR	200'	Soft, blue-green needles, fast-growing; windbreaks, Christmas trees, timber.	Sandy loam, well-drained	Full sun
FRASER FIR	30-60'	Needles are soft dark green. Excellent Christmas tree, fast grower when young.	Well drained & moist	Partial shade or north face.
HIGHBUSH BLUEBERRY	6-12'	Duke: Early-season with late bloom, good fruit size, winter hardy. Blue Crop: Mid-season, high yields, good disease resistance, extremely hardy.	Moist, well-drained	Full sun to partial shade
JAPANESE LARCH	90'	Deciduous, fast-growing timber species; watershed protection, ornamental species. Needles shed.	Variety of soils, but not heavy clay	Full or partial sun
NORWAY SPRUCE	75-80'	Fast growing 1" dark green needles gracefully drooping branches provide wind protection and wildlife shelter.	Average to moist	Full sun to partial shade
OSAGE ORANGE	30-50'	Tolerant of road salt and air pollution-male and female flowers on separate trees great for hedges coppices easily.	Prefers well drained soil	Sun to partial shade
PUSSY WILLOW	6-15'	Will grow in wetlands important browse for many species and attracts pollinators.	Moist well drained soils	Sun
RED STEM DOGWOOD	9'	Grows to 9'; upright shrub with red stem; fruit in mid-August; streambank stabilization; wildlife food.	Tolerates wet soils	Shade tolerant
RIVER BIRCH	70-80'	Multi-stem trunk. Bark vanes from reddish brown to black as tree ages. Good riparian shade tree.	Moist to wet	Grows best in full sun
SPICEBUSH	6-12'	Tolerant of wet shady conditions which make it great for streambanks and wetlands.	Moist to wet	Shade to full sun
WHITE BIRCH	30'-60'	Planted for its stunning white bark, seeds, buds, and catkins eaten by many birds and small mammals, foliage is often browsed by deer.	Moist well-drained soil	Sun to shade
WHITE PINE	100'	Fast growing species that will reach 100' tall. Long, soft, green needles.	Wet, swampy areas	Full sun, partial shade
WILDLIFE PACKETS	Wildlife Habitat Packet #2 - 30 plants / 10 of each of the following: Highbush Cranberry, Silky Dogwood, & Northern White Cedar.			
BIRD-BUTTERFLY MIX	Flower blend designed to attract Hummingbirds and Butterflies all summer long.			
ENVIRO-FRIENDLY MIX	A blend of flowering herbs and wildflower varieties that is designed to attract beneficial insects and desirable birds. Also contains species which will help deter many garden pests. Designed to perform in low light or partial shade conditions, but will grow in full sun also.			
BEE FEED-POLLINATOR	Varieties included to attract bees and other helpful pollinating insects.			
SULFUR	Soil amendment for Blueberries and other acid loving plants. Sulfur helps to lower the pH of the soil for plants that require highly acid soils (pH range of 4.5 to 5.5); such as blueberries, azaleas & rhododendrons.			
FERTILIZER TABLETS	Use 1 tablet per 1/4" stem diameter. One tablet for seedlings, two for transplants.
